proceed to their respective wash rooms, TURN BY TURN. Each pupil will have a place assigned ner in one of the wash rooms. In that room and in no other she is to wash at all times. No washing whatever can be permitted in other parts of the house.

Consent Needed For Baths

The bath-rooms are never to be isited except for the purpose of taking baths. Baths can be taken only by special permission, and at times indicated by the teachers. Each pupil shall make up her bed every morning before breakfast, at the time indicated by the teacher. Articles of bedding shall not be removed from one bed to another, much less to be taken out of the sleeping hall.

No change of places of the beds can be made without the teacher's consent. During the day the sleeping apartments are not to be visited by the scholars. From breakfast to 8:00 a.m., the pupils are to remain in their rooms and devote the time to study and to preparation for recitation hours.

During school or study hours, everything tending to disturb or distract attention, such as whispering or unnecessary talking of any kind, is strictly forbidden. The scholars are particularly enjoined to take good care of their books,
