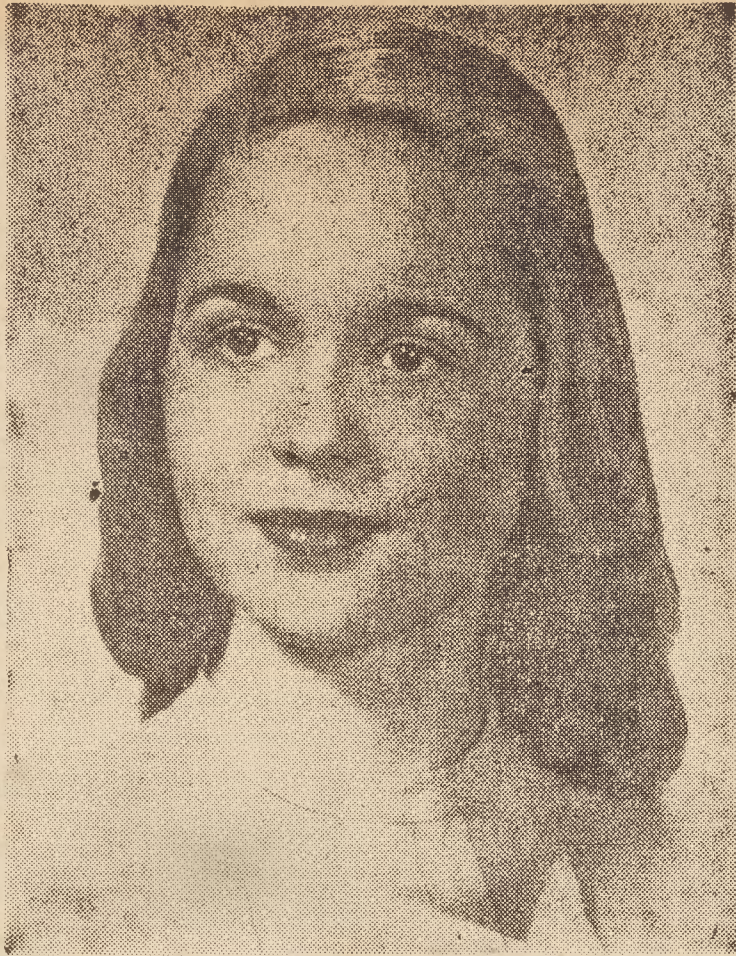


### Campus Shots
