Susie is majoring in public school music. At the present she is learning to play the cornet, a feat of great pride.

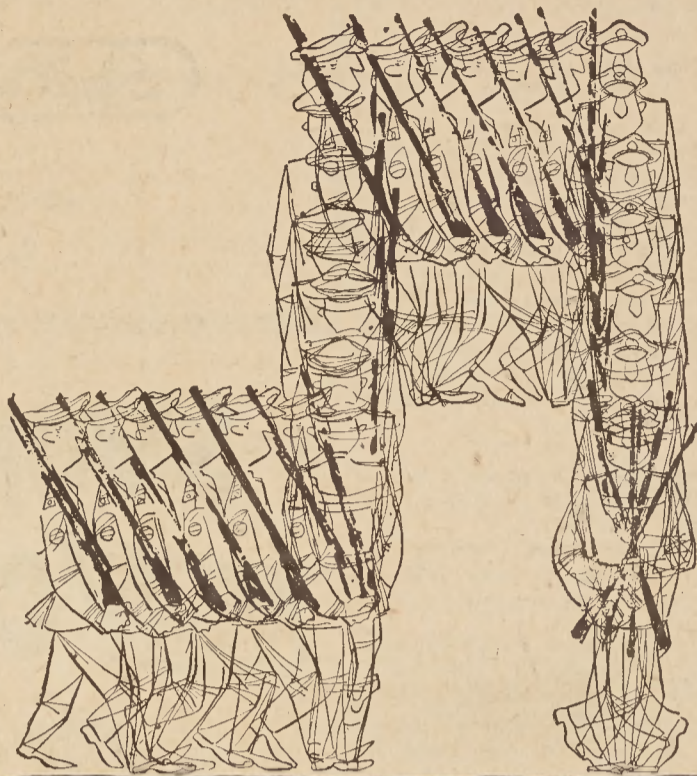
