control. After the March 1 blast, the whole world has viewed the hydrogen bomb with alarm. Last week the administration decided to dispel the fears in the U. S. by releasing as much information on the bomb as security would allow. The first step was to release, to the press and television, an edited film on the 1952 Eniwetok blast. F. B. I. Chief J. Edgar Hoover warned the American people to be on the lookout for enemy bomb smugglers.

The things to look for: (1) a gun-barrel device with a bore between two and ten inches, (2) fissionable material which is extremely heavy for its size, and (3) high-explosives which are usually light tan, have a soapy feel, and half again as heavy as water.

Congress also had something to say about atomic weapons. The House Appropriations committee voted to spend \$1,060,968,000 on atomic and thermonuclear weapons development in the fiscal year 1955.

On the lighter side, the American movie-going public looked to Hollywood and the awarding of Oscars. "From Here to Eternity" won eight of them: best picture; best supporting actor, Frank Sinatra; best supporting actress, Donna Reed; best director, Fred Zinneman; best black and white cinematography, Burnett Guffy; best screenplay, Daniel Taradash; best film editing, William Lyon; best sound recording, John P. Luadary. The rest of the Oscars went to William Holden for best actor (in "Stalag 17"); Audrey Hepburn for best actress (in "Roman Holiday"); and Walt Disney for the cartoon "Toot, Whistle, Plunk, and Boom."
