ON THE LOCAL FRONT (meaning Salem campus), the A. A. is hoping that the girls will get

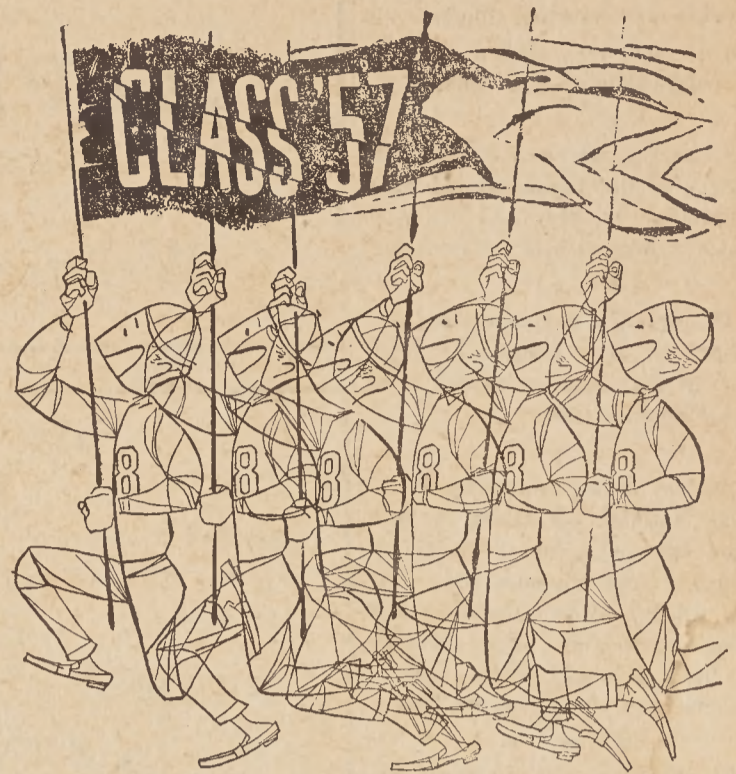
