Brazil: This week Juscelino Kubitschek became the new President of Brazil's 55 million people. Attending the ceremony from the U. S. was a 14 member delegation headed by Vice-President Nixon.

The new President has established the program for his five year term as one of developing the nation's economy by developing industry, electric power, transportation, and by building new highways. The social democrats, apparently impressed by his state's economic development, made Kubitschek their presidential candidate.

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
