Mr. French, who has been at Salem since 1948, has bachelor of arts and masters degrees from Wesleyan University; a masters degree from Yale University; and has done professional study at Boston University, New York University, Howard University, and the University of North Carolina.

Mr. Sawyer, who is also college chaplain, holds bachelor of science and masters degrees from Lehigh University and a Bachelor of Divinity degree from the Moravian Theological Seminary. He has done professional study at Duke University, Union Theological Seminary, and Columbia University. Mr. Sawyer has been on the faculty here since 1949.

Miss Vardell, who joined the Salem faculty in 1946, is currently a Fulbright Scholar in Frankfurt, Germany, while on leave from Salem. A graduate of Salem, she has a masters degree from the University of Rochester.

Mr. Heidemann has a bachelor of music degree from Salem, a piano diploma from the Juilliard School of Music, and has done professional study at Brooklyn Conservatory. He has also studied privately with Rudolph Serkin, Wallingford-Riegger, Moriz and Hedwig Rosenthal, and Felix Deyo. He has been on the faculty here since 1951.

Mrs. Jacobowsky joined the Salem faculty in 1950. She has a bachelor of science degree from Juilliard and a masters degree from the Teachers College of Columbia University.

Trustees gave their approval last week to the budget for the new fiscal year of more than \$650,000; the budget carries with it a 15% salary increase and other faculty benefits.

Womble trust fund for scholarships was also accepted by the board. The initial amount of the fund was \$,000. This will help to expand the scholarship fund program.

The Van W. Norfleet student loan fund was given and the amount of \$4,500 was transferred, with the accord of the Norfleet family, to the library endowment. The income, it was decided, could be used more effectively as an endowment for the library than otherwise.

The faculty pay raises from a 3½% to a 5% annuity in faculty salaries. This annuity would be in addition to whatever social security

benefits a faculty member would be entitled to. Also included is a group life insurance for all employees with the premium paid by the academy and college. These provisions become effective September 1.

Dr. Gramley reported that the Salem College Progress Fund pledges now total \$1,698,000. Other items in Dr. Gramley's report included the tennis court construction, plans for a student center on the ground floor of Old Chapel, and the summer schedule for other campus improvements.

The Board approved the purchase of a new practice pipe organ to be installed in Memorial Hall.
