

History Film Planned For Monday Night

On Monday, May 6, the history department is presenting a film, **The Fight for Peace**, in Old Chapel at 8:00 p.m.

The film is considered the best documentary of the years between World War I and World War II, presenting a survey of world history from Versailles to Munich and showing the break down of International Law and the growth of the aggressor nations.

The events of the film include: 1917 events in Russia; rare films of Lenin; historic last films of the Russian Royal family; Japan leaving the League of Nations in defiance after the invasion of China; the bombing of Shanghai; domestic policies of Hitler; and many more of the important events that occurred between World War I and World War II.

Among the personalities in the film are Franklin D. Roosevelt, Anthony Eden, Pope Pius, Adolph Hitler, Stalin, Lenin, and Hirohito.

Walter Winchell said of the film: "Americans should see **The Fight for Peace** to realize how good they have it. The film rates an orchid."
