Also, the general public should be exposed to a Shakespearean production. It is being done on a modified Shakespearean stage built in front of the stage in Old Chapel. It is not a question of room, but a presentation of drama in which the actors confront the audience. For it is necessary that the audience have contact with the actors in order for the play to come

On the subject of "method acting", Mr. Carver replied, "Most people do not know what 'method acting' really is. The idea itself is grand, but I don't agree with the practice of mumblers. It is sufficient and apt for our age and time, but there is nothing I hate worse than a mumbler on stage."
