

# Hills Investigates Slump

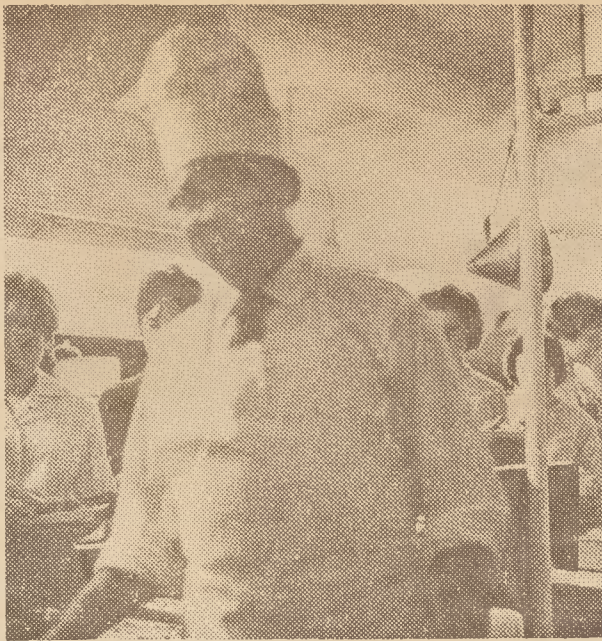
