

# Dr. Mysels Enjoys Leisurely Life At Salem College, Winston-Salem

Dr. Estella Mysels is presently teaching two chemistry courses, Biochemistry and Qualitative Organics, in the Chemistry Department. She has been living in Winston-Salem since November, 1966, and has been teaching at Salem since the beginning of second semester.

Dr. Mysels was born in Berlin, Germany, and lived there until she went to Switzerland for a secondary school education. She studied her first year of undergraduate work at the University of Geneva. She received her B.S. in chemistry from the University of California at Berkeley, where she also got her Ph.D. Her doctorate thesis topic was the color and constitution of diphenylmethane dyes.

For hobbies and interests, she enjoys gardening and reading about current events. When she had more time away from research, she used

to hike and swim. She also enjoys good music and art, particularly American Indian art. She is going with her husband next week to Miami for the spring meeting of the American Chemical Society.

Dr. Mysels has done extensive research in physical organic chemistry. She spent two years in New York City working on the analytical aspects of steroid metabolism for the Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research. She has worked on air pollution in Los Angeles for about two years.

When asked how she finds teaching in a small girls college, she replied, "It's very different here with such small classes as compared with the large classes where I've been." She was an instructor at Berkeley and at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles. Dr. Mysels commented on living in North Carolina, "Life in Winston-Salem is more homogeneous than Los Angeles and I like it very much."

# Three Salemites To Begin Medical Technology Studies

Nancy Lineberger, Sallie Thomas, and Elizabeth Wilhelm have been accepted into Bowman Gray's Medical Technological program. The girls were accepted this past winter after two strenuous days of testing and interviewing. The program begins June 8 and will end a year later with the required State Boards. After completing their year at Bowman Gray they will receive a certificate from the Medical Technology Department as well as a B.S. degree from Salem.

Preparing for the Med. Tech. program requires a schedule with a heavy load of labs without study in a particular subject as a major or minor. Nancy Lineberger, from Charlotte, did not decide to enter the program until her sophomore year. For this reason she found it necessary to drop her history major and now finds herself taking seven labs a week! With interests in medicine, Sallie Thomas from Ox-

ford and Elizabeth Wilhelm from Columbia, South Carolina, came to Salem particularly for its Med. Tech. program and therefore have fewer labs than Nancy.

The three girls look forward to their year at Bowman Gray and will live in Kimberly Apartments owned by the hospital. In spite of hard work consisting of classes, working with patients, running analyses for the pathologists and other duties, they are also looking forward to the fall when they will assist in the teaching of incoming medical students, do some knitting, swim in their pool, and become members of the "Sticking Team" (shots). Aside from a desire to work in their home states the girls have no preference as to where they would like to work after graduation.

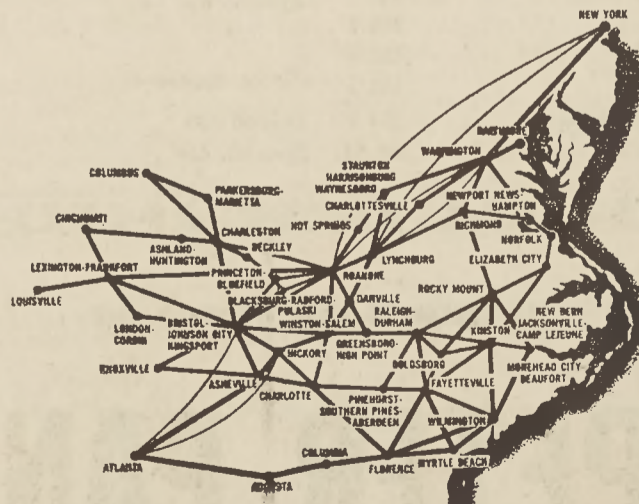
