Baseball great Jackie Robinson was buried in New York last Friday before a large crowd of admirers. Robinson, who died of a heart attack at age 53, was the first black man to play professional baseball when he signed with the old Brooklyn Dodgers at the age of 25. Both the ball club and Robinson himself took much abuse on the racial question. Jackie just kept silent and reacted to the remarks the best way he knew how -- with a base hit. His average grew with his field of fans as he took out his frustrations by playing super baseball.

Former teammates, managers, and sports commentators served as pallbearers, and many baseball greats were present.

Golf has put Wake Forest in the spot light once again, Lanny Wadkins, former Deacon star, collected \$27,000.00 by winning the Sahara Invitational Tournament last weekend. In doing so, Wadkins established a record for season earnings by a rookie pro.

He earned \$114,766 this season and ranks eighth among the touring pros.

Jack Nicklaus who finished fifth in the tournament is still earnings leader with \$290,542. Lee Trevino is second with \$200,005.00 which is not bad for a few rounds around the course.
