Hot Toddies Join Other Fine Drinks

On a chilly autumn evening there is nothing better than a soothing hot drink. Hot drinks are great for friends because they are just pick-me-upper on a cold day. They are great when you are under the weather too. Pop-corn and cheese are great companions.

NUT-COATED CHEESE LOG
8 oz. cream cheese, softened
4 oz. Roquefort or blue cheese. 1 jar cheddar cheese spread (sharp). 1 tbs. Worcestershire sauce. 1 tbs. grated onion. 1/2 tbs. salt. Finely chopped nuts.

Thoroughly blend all the ingredients except the parsley and nuts - chill thoroughly. Shape cheese mixture into a log or mound on piece of aluminum foil and roll evenly with desired amounts of parsley and nuts. Wrap, chill until ready to serve.

FOR EACH DRINK:
Heat about 1/2 cup pineapple-grapefruit juice (sweetened) May add just a small amount of whiskey which makes it great. Serve with cinnamon stick or dash of cinnamon. Serve in mugs. Hot cider and orange juice make a good hot drink. For each drink mix about 1/2 cup of each. Heat and serve with cinnamon stick. May also add some whiskey.
