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(4) President -- No, facultyadvisory board, yes. The President of a college's job is not to be "Big Daddy" to all the students. The SGA President's advisor is the Dean of Women; however the College President should be involved as much as time will allow.

(5) Yes, this is a vital link.

(6) Yes.

(7) Yes, Salem's honor system is valid. It is unique in that students are trusted to handle the responsibilities of upholding such a system.

(8) The honor system could be made more effective by impressing upon the incoming freshmen the importance of the system, and by the upperclassmen setting good examples.

(9) I do not think they have been handled too lightly. One good thing about rule infractions is that they are not made public.
(10) Yes -- I think it is a good idea that all "clubs" at Salem are non-discriminatory and every student is a member.

(11) No -- at least not for every meal. I like homecooked meals, not tablets from vending machines. Cafeteria style eating could work efficiently at Salem, though if students would not all come at the same time and have to stand in line for an hour, like we did on Feb. 12th.

(12) Yes, post the times it will be open in a conspicuous place so more students would be encouraged to use it.

(13) Work through the Interclub Council for communication.(14) Yes, with the exception of married day students.

(15) Make things more open to students so that fewer rumors will be fostered.

 The cost of adding a gynecologist to the staff could not be fairly paid for by all students since that service would not apply to enough students. Family planning service should be more available to those students desiring the service by personally arranging for a local doctor to serve students through referral by Dr. Pennell. Transportation cases which have come to my attention have been handled with common sense, a must for any subjective decision.

(10) IRS has rightly tried to adjust the traditions of Salem to the general wishes of the student body as a whole. It must remain an organization for all students, for without the support of the students it would be ineffective.

(11) I feel other options are open to improve the refectory food and service. A more active student role in planning could provide realistic improvements in the menu. Allowing students scholarship hours for working for the refectory could add to the amount of financial aid available while letting Salem students improve the general service.

(12) No answer.

(13) The calendar has been effective in the past and reduced general clutter by repetitious notices. Additional use of the newspaper as a club column, etc. would also give students an established place for finding out what clubs are doing.

(14) Any club open to all members of the student body that interests a significant number of students should be funded by the SGA dues, as without this financial support many clubs could not function.

(15) The treasurers should let students know when and where their money is being spent instead of giving them a meaningless figure. A concerted attempt to find out what charges the students would like to see in the campus would let the students being represented have a more active role in the monetary affairs of the SGA. Enlisting the students' opinions in SGA decision-making would also give the student body a more valid participation in SGA affairs.

(1) Salem is a small girls' school with high academic standards. The students are friendly and have close relationships both among themselves and with the adminsitration. The school is surrounded by history and tradition and is somewhat conservative, but it is possible for students to make changes in a peaceful manner. in it and have a high respect for Salem's reputation as an honorable school. I think most students have that respect.

(8) Our honor system could be made more effective if a student had the duty rather than the right to turn in a person who has broken the honor code. I think the system is effective as it stands now and I don't think this change is necessary or desirable. I'm glad the student is given a choice whether to turn someone in or not.

(9) I can't answer this question since I don't know how rule infractions have been handled. It's not my business to know how a person has been punished for breaking a rule.

(10) IRS can encourage or discourage students to uphold Salem's honor and traditions, but it is up to the students or the student body as a whole to decide whether it will be done. IRS and other clubs should continue as organizations for all students as long as each student pays those club fees.

(11) Right now I am opposed to cafeteria food service since I would hate waiting in line for every meal and because I do not believe the refectory is equipped to handle cafeteria service. I also think that family style service makes Salem more like a home and less like an institution. I can't make a definite opinion, though, until we have had our weekly trial cafeteria service.

(12) The book exchange should be run more efficiently if it were open longer and if books that are no longer used were put away or sold on a shelf separated from the books in use. (13) I think clubs should keep each other informed in their programs and projects and perhaps work together in money-raising projects.

(14) Yes, clubs cannot function without money, and the easiest way to raise the necessary money is for each student to pay a small fraction of the total amount. Think of all the moneyraising projects we'd have on campus if each club had to raise its own money.

(15) Since the treasurer serves in both legislative board and executive boards I could make any position more efficient by first knowing students' opinions on various issues and then working to bring about the necessary changes. jor link in student faculty relations and I believe that in order for Salem College to operate successfully -- this is a necessity. (5) Yes, I believe this board does contribute greatly to an improved relationship between the students and faculty. I think it is advantageous for the students to have such a board to express their viewpoints, who in turn, can clearly express these views to the faculty.

(6) Yes, I believe that our faculty advisory board does operate successfully. I think that both the faculty and the students consider this board important and useful in determining, solving and meeting the various needs of the college.

(7) Yes, I believe the Honor System here at Salem is valid. Each individual is trusted by others and is expected at the same time to fulfill that trust. It is a 2-way system and needs the support of the students and faculty in order to fulfill its expectations and duties.

(3) In a small college community such as Salem, it is necessary to have some discipline method for minor offenses and to remind students of their responsibility to others. The calldown system is neither perfect nor completely effective, but it still seems to be the best system for our needs.

(4) The SGA President is supposed to represent the student body's opinions. She should work closely with the President and the faculty-advisory board, and express to them the feelings of Salem students.

(14) As long as all students are members of the clubs, and a long as the club projects are for the benefit of the entire student body, club fees should be in cluded in SGA fees.
