successful is FAB getting a petition through to the administration. To be perfectly honest, until recently I did not know. In order to find out what really happened to a petition I had to ask someone associated with the whole process. As was pointed out to me, in the event that there was any disagreement between the recommendation of FAB and the college president, any group has the right to ask for a hearing before the board of Trustees. The delay of action factor is that the student body is left ignorant of action taken. More publication of action taken by legislative board, FAB, the college president, and trustees could rectify the situation. (7&8) Perhaps it is too idealistic to expect a student to turn in either herself or a fellow student, and to be responsible for her actions without some type of reinforcement. As it stands now our honor system seems to be ineffectual in bringing about desired results due to the fact that the general student body has no conception of actions taken by Honor Council. Our system could be more effective if individual infringements of the honor system and action taken were enumerated and publicized with no personal references mentioned. Students would then realize the possible consequences of their actions (or the consequences of their possible actions) as related to themselves and the general student body.

(9) A major weakness in handling infractions involves the student who does not take it upon herself to confront a violator.

(10) The only traditions that IRS seems to uphold are those of remaining unseated before meals and IRS weekends. Christmas Tree Lighting is actually the most important tradition for which IRS is responsible. IRS is a vital organization, but its importance lies not in honor and traditions but in providing social activities with a community spirit in mind. Giving a call down for violating set social standards (such as "walking across the grass, wearing scarves over curlers, or misbehaving in assembly") does not bestow honor upon Salem because the call down system is virtually ineffective.

(11) I am in favor of the family style; however, student and refectory staff relationships could be greatly improved.

(12) Does it run? SSC should set deadlines and keep them, the result being more organization. Right now it's a chaotic situation. Also, it could be of better service to students if opened more frequently. Why not stock current used paper backs in the exchange?

(13) Great.

(14) Yes -- If clubs are to exist. It is important to remember that several clubs, such as the YWCA sponsor many activities in the Winston-Salem area that reflect back on the whole student body.

(15) I'd like to see the formation of an appointed committee which would work closely with SGA president and the administration in opening more channels.
