The Epilepsy Information Service is a toll-free, statewide telephone information service of the Comprehensive Epilepsy Program, Department of Neurology, Bowman Gray School of Medicine. It was developed in order to make information or seizures more readily available to residents in all parts of the state.

The service provides information about seizures, treatment services and facilities, guidance and referral services, and many other aspects of epilepsy. The Epilepsy Information Service is coordinated with the Epilepsy Association of North Carolina. Any North Carolina resident may reach the Epilepsy Information Service by calling toll-free, 1-800-642-0500. Residents in

the Winston-Salem calling area should call 727-4565.

The telephone line is in operation from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. An answering device will be used for after-hour calls and on week-ends. These calls will be returned the next working day. Operators are instructed not to make recommendations about treatment or diagnostic procedures. Callers are always advised to discuss their concerns with their physicians and a disclaimer is used when answering medically related calls from the general public.

TEST DATES FOR EXAMINATIONS NATIONAL TEACHER ANNOUNCED

PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY, September 3. Students completing teacher preparation programs and advanced degree candidates in specific fields may take the National Teacher Examinations on any of three different test dates in 1979-80. Educational Testing Service, the nonprofit, educational organization that administers this testing program, said today that the tests will be given November 10, 1979, February 16, 1980, and July 19, 1980 at test centers throughout the United States.

Results of the National Teacher Examinations are considered by many large school districts as one of several factors in the selection of new teachers and used by several states for the credentialing of teachers or licensing of advanced candidates. Some colleges require all seniors preparing to teach to take the examinations.

On each full day of testing, registrants may take the Common Examinations, which measure their professional preparation and general educational background, and/or an Area Examination that measures their mastery of the subject they expect to teach.

Prospective registrants should contact the school systems in which they seek employment, their colleges, or appropriate educational association for advice about which examinations to take and when to take them.

The Bulletin of Information contains a list of test centers and general information about the examinations, as well as a registration form. Copies may be obtained from college placement officers, school personnel departments, or directly from National Teacher Examinations, Box 911, Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey 08541.

6. Attention **GRAMLEY RESIDENTS: ABSOLUTELY NO PARKING IN FRONT OF OLD SALEM RESIDENT'S HOMES FROM 9:00 a.m. UNTIL 10:00 p.m.**

This includes Blum Walnut, and Church Streets.

7. The gate on back campus is locked at eight p.m.

These rules have been set up because of problems that Salem residents and members of our Moravian Church have had in parking their cars. Please out consideration for these members of our Salem community, obey these rules and park your car in the appropriate places. These rules will be strictly enforced!!
