

New Award to Honor Salemite Reporter

An award for journalism has been established by an anonymous donor in memory of Alicia Nancy Stephens who was director of public relations at Salem and advisor to *The Salemite* from 1975 until her death on October 15, 1982.

The Alicia Nancy Stephens Award for Journalism will honor a student who has demonstrated outstanding contributions and support to the advancement of quality reporting in *The Salemite*.

The precision, competence, industry, and commitment to excellence which Nancy Stephens brought to all of her journalistic endeavors will be the criteria on which the award is made.

Letters of nomination will be submitted by the staff of *The Salemite* and the faculty to Publications Board for review. The selection will be made by the Board and the award will be conferred at Honors Convocation in May.

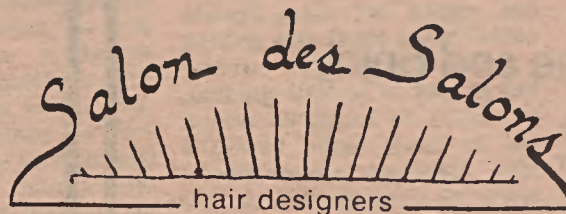
