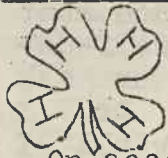

## N.C. CROP IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION SEED JUDGING CONTEST-----NASH COUNTY FEDERATION MEETING

On February 2, 1940, the Bailey Chapter of the Future Farmers of America was represented by a seed judging team at the North Carolina Crop Improvement Association Conference and seed Exposition held in Greenville. This team was composed of Thomas Finch, Cecil Brantley, George Lee Bisette, and Charles Modlin, who were the best in a judging contest held in the local chapter. These boys made the highest score of any F.F.A. team entered from Nash County. The team was trained and accompanied to Greenville by E. A. Howton, agriculture teacher.

On February 9, 1940, the Bailey Chapter was host to the Nash County Federation of the Future Farmers of America at a county-wide meeting followed by a barbecue supper. The Federation is made up of the seven F. F. A. Chapters of Nash County: Bervenue, Bailey, Coopers, Middlesex, Spring Hope, Red Oak, and Nashville. The business of the meeting centered around the Federation Basketball Tournament to
