Mrs. Watson, from Bailey, replaces Miss Melba Martin, who is teaching senior English at Freemont, N. C. Miss Farmer, of Bailey, succeeds Mrs. H. A. Morse, who joins the math department at Tarboro High School; Mrs. Hinton, teacher at Spring Hope last year, is from Rocky Mount. Miss Farmer taught at Spring Hope; Mrs. Watson at Corinth-Holder.

Emphasized activities for the year will be music, chapel programs, citizenship, and physical training, according to Mr. M. W. Weaver.

Music will be supervised by Mrs. H. R. Hinton.

Weekly, students will meet in chapel with an appointed teacher responsible for a program.

MAIN GOAL

Intensified citizenship will be the goal again this year. The regular citizenship medal will be awarded at the end of the year, but no money as an extra compensation has been donated so far.

Activity period is to be on a more systematic plan. All pupils are to be with their home room teacher on the playground or in a special study hall.
