"When I was in high school, I always looked forward to the day when after graduation, I could receive the Bugle and get all the news, and while

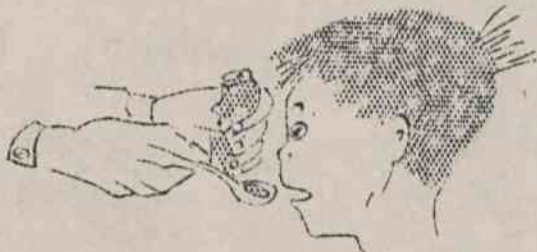
