B.H.S. Places\$400 Order For Library Books

Teachers have just placed a \$400 order for library books, the money having been

provided for by the state, the county, and the school. Each of the 20 teachers was allowed to list a \$20 order, which amounted to \$400.

Of this total, \$216 came from the state, or \$12 for each of the 18 stateteachers allotted Bailey.

COUNTY FUNDS

Nash County will match up to \$70 any amount school in the county will raise. Bailey matched this maximum sum.

The \$70 put up by the school was made possible by the high school library fee of \$.50 per student. State, county, and school allotments then amounted to \$356.

OFFICE FUND
