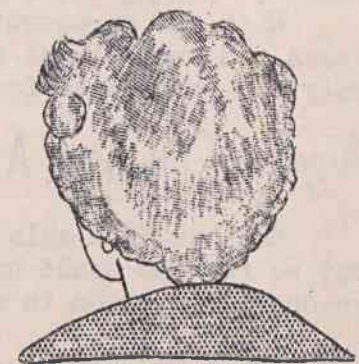
Jimmy Bennett and Bobby
