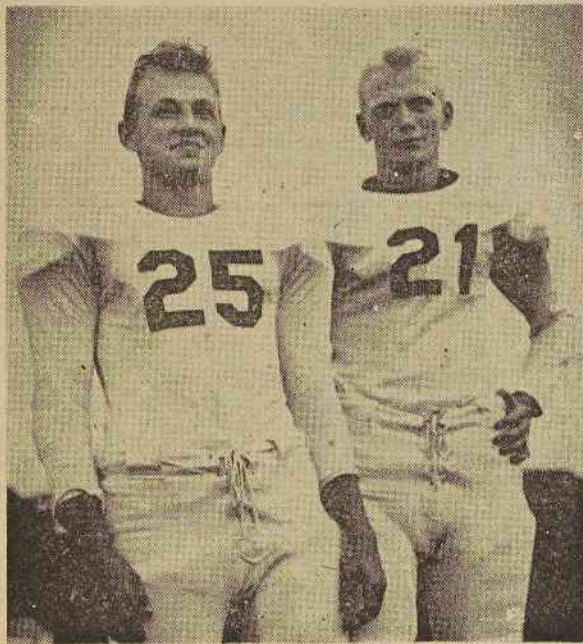


Sportraits

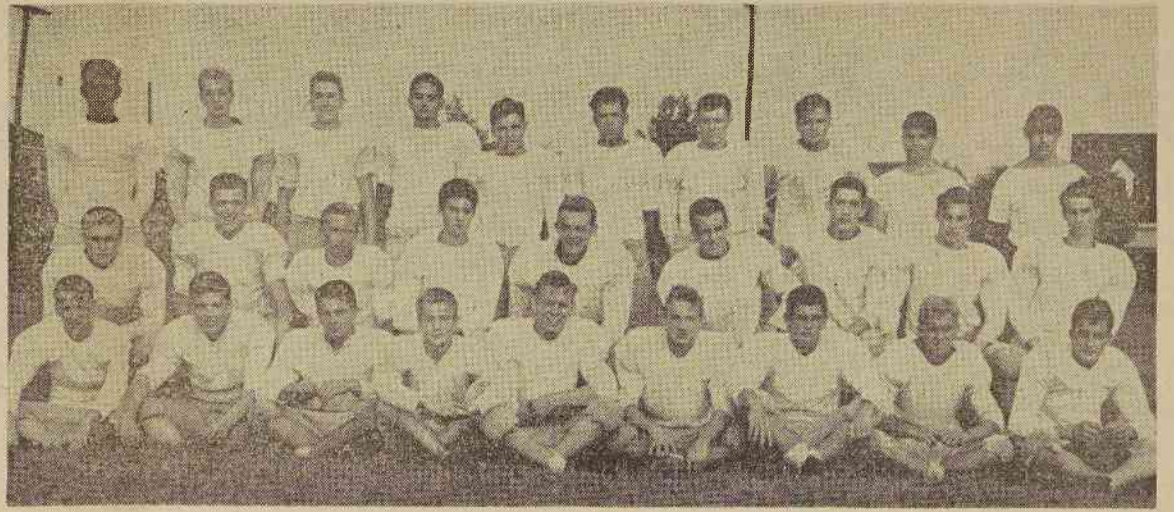
