It shall cause me a great pleasure and happiness to learn concerning your country.

My name is Sophia the Ophlia. I am fourteen years of age and have four brothers: Costas—15, Nicholas—13, Angelos—10, and Therdu.

If you wish to learn concerning my country, the conditions are really bad as you have perhaps learned from your periodicals, continually shootings and killings. My father is a verli of the Italian Campaign and was wounded. He cannot support our family. We, of course, are little and therefore cannot help him in any small way in support of our family.

Don't neglect to write me and in the future letter I shall write more. Write me if you too have brothers and sisters and all about your country.
