

# Quakes Win One Lose One On Western Tour

The GHS Earthquakes Closed their only scheduled western tour December 10 when they dropped the second game of the two games played in that section of the state, to the Jay-Vees of Elon College. The Quakes had won the first game of the tour by Squeezing past Burlington 44-43 on December 9.

G. F. Seymour's foul shot with three seconds left in the game broke a 43-43 tie and gave the Quakes the game against the Bulldogs who are rated as one of the strongest teams in the Western AA conference.

The Quakes had led the Bulldogs throughout the first half, but the Westerners put on a third quarter drive which brought them up even with the locals. Both teams fought on fairly even terms throughout the fourth period with each team playing its best brand of basketball.

The Saturday night tussle, played in Elon College's gym, was an easy victory for the Junior Christians although they won by an eight point, 33-25 margin.

The Christians led all the way and were very effective in breaking up the Qake plays. They also hadu the advantage of having a much taller team which listed several prep standouts of recent years.

The Quakes will meet Washington's Pam-Pack in the William Street Gym tonight.

Versatility at all positions of the squad has been shown by Mac, who has played quarterback, tackle, fullback, and he received action as half back in the Shrine Bowl game. His football career began on the junior varsity as tackle, at which position he attracted a great deal of attention, but on graduation he has shown agility as a ball handler.

Is Line Plunger

Line plunging is Mac's strongest point, and he has shown just how strong at that point he is by having a remarkable average of six yard per carry. Kicking and passing also are in Junior's line of duty, as he is the squad's regular punter and is always a constant aerial threat.

Each summer, in order to keep in shape for the gridiron wars, Mac serves as water front director at nearby Tuscarora Scout Camp. Junior stands 5' 10" and carries a solid 190 pounds, and uses every pound of it in line plunges, as opposing linesmen will quickly verify.

Loves His Sports

Sports of every kind appeal to McRoy, who is a North Carolina Golden Gloves champ, an excellent swimmer, and plays a good game of baseball and basketball, having played the latter two in Junior varsity competition. Football is the number one sport with Mac, but that still doesn't distract anything from the other sports as far as he is concerned.
