The Goldsboro High School Earthquakes were handed their fifth loop loss by as many different squads on January 31 when the Raleigh Capitals soundly defeated them by a score of 65-43. The game was played in the Needham Broughton gym in Raleigh.

From the opening whistle, the Caps showed they were out to win as they quickly grabbed an 8-2 lead they slowly increased as the game proceeded. Pulling to within 5 points of the Caps at the beginning of the last quarter, it looked as though the local quintet would stage an efficient comeback. However, going out within 3 minutes of each other were Bell, Hallow and Percise on personal fouls. This broke the backbone of the Goldsboro team and they carried little opposition to the scoring spree staged by the Caps.

Capturing scoring honors for the victorious Caps were Hayes and Johnson with 14 and 10 points respectively. For the Quakes, it was Bell and Percise with 13 points each.

Earthquakes Beat Fayetteville Here

Setting out to gain their second conference win, the Goldsboro High School Earthquakes accomplished this feat at the expense of the Fayetteville Bulldogs by a 69-61 win. It was an ample measure of revenge for a 65-40 upset suffered at the hands of the Fayetteville fivesome earlier in the season. The game was played in Goldsboro on February 3.

A faster moving and more exciting game has scarcely been witnessed during the '50-'51 season. The lead changed hands numerous times and at no time of the ball game could the crowd be sure of the outcome.

Taking scoring honors for the night was Bill Webb of the Fayetteville squad with 24 points. He was closely followed by Quake Guard Ronald Percise with 21. The score by quarters, with the Goldsboro points listed first, was 23-17, 31-33, 52-45, and 69-61.

Junior Ball Squad Defeats Rosewood

Having one of their "on" nights, the Goldsboro High School junior squad defeated the Rosewood team by a score of 35-22. Completely outclassed, the rural quintet never had a chance during the entire game. The game was played in Goldsboro on January 26.

The amount and depth of reserves was a big factor as the Rosewood squad had only six men. This, however, in no way detracted from the sparkling play exhibited by the local five.

Capturing scoring honors for Baby Quakes were 8 and 7 points. For Rosewood it was Mitchell and Davis, each getting 6 points.

Wilson Defeats Junior Quintet

Greater height and teamwork were the top advantages in the engagement in which the Wilson Juclones defeated the Goldsboro High School Jayvees 33-28. The game was played in Wilson on February 8.

From the very beginning, the Wilson quintet showed they would tolerate no foolishness as they proceeded to run up a 17-10 lead in the first half. At the beginning of the second half, however, the Baby Quakes looked like an entirely different team as, playing hard, they pulled to within one point of tying up matters by scoring six quickpoints to make the score 17-16. The Juclones quickly took control again and pulled out into the lead. Although they led the entire game, the outcome was never certain.

Leading the victorious Juclones was their husky captain, Dawson, with 13 points. For the Quakes, it was Jenkins and Howell with 10 and 8 points, respectively.
