
Kiwanians Honor Student Leaders, **3 Boys-Of-Month**

> An estimated 437 students out of 601 have said they would buy a directory which will cost approximately twenty-five cents.


Miss Kitchin hopes that the directory will be released for the students to buy before Christmas. As yet, however, there is no definite date set for the directory to come out.
