10 Seniors Receive Coveted NHS Tap In Traditional Rite

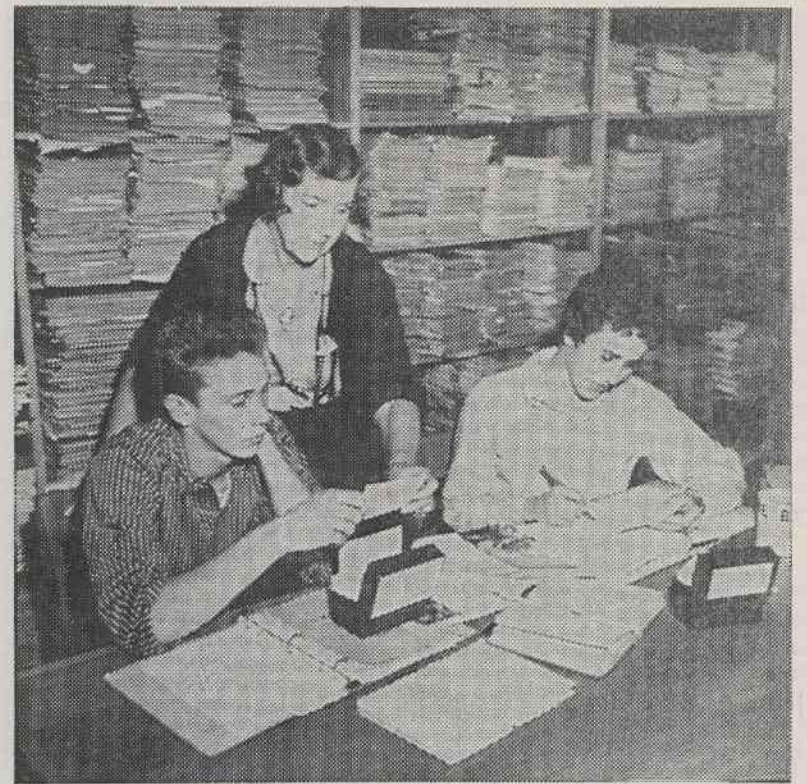
Ten seniors received the coveted tapping into the Romonoca chapter of the National Honor Society in a traditional candlelight ceremony during a special assembly, November 6.
