**University Of North Carolina**

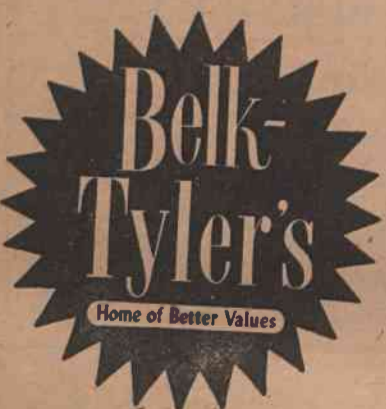
