Students Journey To See Hermit At Fort Fisher



Living at Fort Fisher practically alone for over seven years, Robert Harrell has met and conquered most of the obstacles that have faced him in his attempt to write a book. Born and raised in Shelby, North Carolina, he encountered many problems in his early life, one of which was his education. "I have tried every since I was fourteen years of age to get an education by working my way through sev-eral schools," Robert says of his schooling.

He attended Garner-Webb Junior College and taught typing to finance his education there. At one time, he was taught psychology by an instructor of Albert Einstein. After attending other schools in Washington and New York, he settled down in Shelby, working in print shops and event-
