Bebo White discussed how the use of profanity reflects back on the user. He told the students that profanity is the way a small mind tries to express itself forcefully.

Miss Louise Parker's psychology class journeyed to Raleigh to visit Dorothea Dix Hospital. The purpose of this trip was to observe the treatment of the mentally ill. The bus, which was chartered and paid for by the students, left Senior High at 8:30 Thursday morning.

During this part of the psychology course, the students have been studying mental health and mental illness. They have learned how to deal with the mentally ill, and that it is a sickness which must be treated by a trained staff of doctors and nurses.

If after the visit to the mental hospital, sufficient time re-

mains, the students had planned to visit the State Home for the Blind, also in Raleigh. The bus returned to Rocky Mount at approximately 4:00 p. m.
