"In addition to this," adds Mr. Mizelle, "we will be in Salsburg, Bregenz, Lucerne, and Interlaken during their musical festivals and other special events. Tickets for these events can be reserved."

The Alpine Camping Tour is a dream come true for Vance Mizelle, who is an Assistant Professor of English at N.C. Wesleyan College, teaching courses in Chaucer and the history of the English language.

With his wife and three children he has had considerable camping experience, both at home and abroad. Four years ago the Mizelles enjoyed a 90-day camping tour of the Continent—mainly Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Italy and Holland.
