He received his B.S. degree from East Carolina University in 1960 and has since been working toward his M.A. degree.

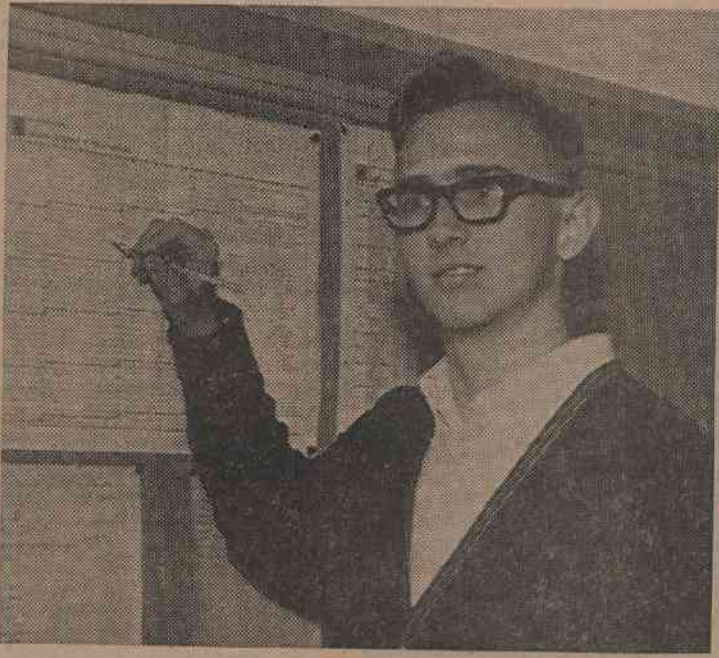
