The Christmas season was officially opened with the lighting of the Magic Christmas Tree at Tarrytown Mall Friday night, November 27. Mayor John Minges welcomed the huge crowd and then introduced Rev. George Dudley, pastor of Mt. Zion Baptist Church, who gave the invocation. Following this, Second District Congressman L. H. Fountain threw the switch to light the tree.

Over 3,000 people anxiously awaited the glorious event. Smiling faces were seen everywhere at Tarrytown. Children's eyes glowed at the 720 lights which changed color in the rhythm to the music. Under this beautiful tree were gift wrapped packages from the Tarrytown merchants. The fir, weighing almost 2 tons, was acquired from Boone, N. C. and required 113 gallons of white paint.

George Braswell, general manager of Tarrytown, gave the history of the Christmas Music Festival and tree lighting to an enthusiastic crowd. He went on to explain that the purpose of the first tree in 1965 was to put the real meaning into Christmas. Realizing the interest of so many people, the idea was expanded until it grew into the full Christmas music festival it is today--thereby becoming a permanent part of Tarrytown.

Many groups throughout eastern Carolina will participate in the festival throughout the Christmas season. Already under the direction of Mrs. Antoinette W.
