## Gryphon Matmen Gain Revenge; Overcome Knights, Beat Vikings

Starring roles presented by Freddy Williams, Ray Brinn, Cleveland Harris, and Mike Stills made the faces of mentors Phil Harris and Stan Bastian light up almost as brightly as the 36-29 score which shone from the scoreboard. The Rocky Mount matmen had been handed their worst defeat of the season by the Knights only two weeks previously.

Cleveland Harris completely outfought and outhustled Ray Davis for a pin in the 140 pound class, and Pete Tapia, wrestling a much heavier Alvin Sessoms, was pinned in the 147 pound match. Randy Price of Northern decisioned Gary Kirkman, and in the 169 bout, "Tick" Vick was pinned by Frank Cooper. MacDonald Vick pinned Rocky Mount's Johnny Carr in the 187 pound grouping.

A bloodbath occurred when David Jones and Leon Manning collided with Manning winning by decision. Tank Leonard won by forfeit to insure Rocky Mount their fourth victory of the year.

The Gryphon Grapplers chalked up their third win,

Thursday, January 27, with a conference victory over Kinston, 37-21. The Rocky Mount matmen were also helped out by the flu epidemic which had depleted the ranks of the Kinston squad.

In the 100 pound class, Jerry Battle collected six points by forfeit. Freddy Williams. who moved up to 107 for this match, was decisioned by Greg Manly. Russell Harper worked Doug Schultz over for a fourpoint decision, and Ray Brinn fell to his first defeat as he was upended by Jeff Taylor by decision. Probably the high point of the match was the 134 contest, which pitted Cleveland Harris against Mike Stephenson. Harris took charge right from the start, and before he could work up a sweat, Stephenson was pinned-in just 31 sec-

Heavyweight Action Mike Stills, who moved up to the 140 pound class, devastated Jim Rapier for three points. Pete Tapia was pinned in the 147 pound division, and Brooks Bolyston decisioned Gary Kirkman. Quick-moving Oliver "Tick" Vick decisioned Gary Green, and Johnny Carr was pinned by Ray Rause. In the 197 lb. division, David Jones pinned Charley Coward, and "Tank Leonard" continued his unbeaten string of 10 wins with a victory by forfeit.
