Ejim is a member of the Ibo Tribe, one of six or seven tribes in Nigeria. Each tribe has its own language, but all speak English. He added that he has been speaking English since he was six.

Mr. Ejim was originally a student at Ohio State University, but he transferred to Wesleyan where he has been for four semesters. He plans to return to Africa after completing his Master's Degree.
