Elizabeth Exum leaves her scatterbrain to Cindy Gurganus.

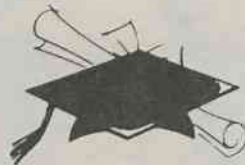

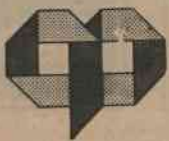
