Twenty years from now Buddy Luper will be doing the hula.

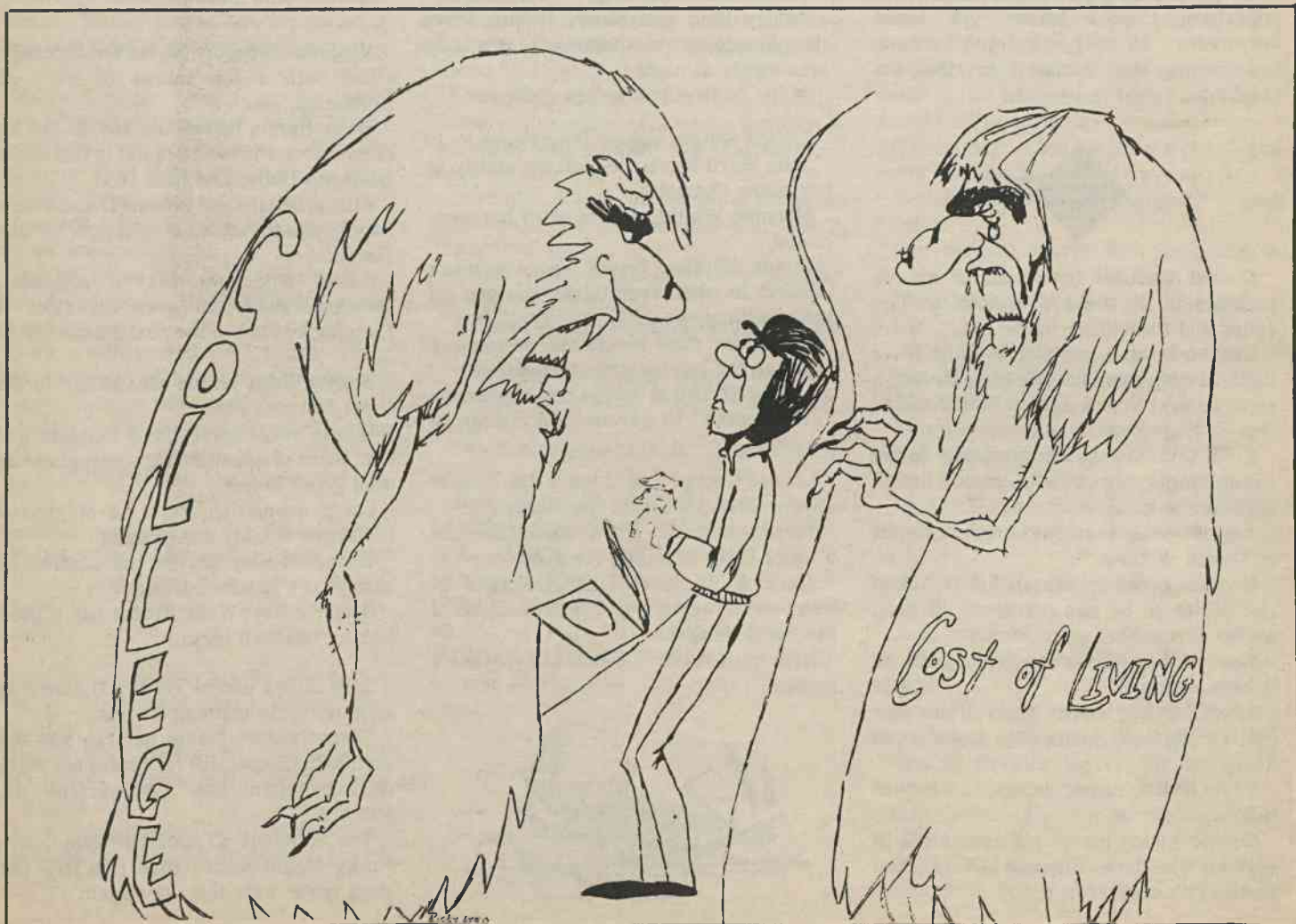
