

Sailing, however, is an expensive sport. Every year off the coast of Rhode Island the U.S. holds a sail boating race. and boats from all over the world compete for a gold cup. Sailors unlike most sports contestants hope for windy

Sail boats range from single masted boats to three or four masted ships. The smaller boats can be sailed in reservoirs or large lakes. These boats are usually five feet to 15 feet long. The larger sailing vessels are usually sailed in sounds or the ocean. The wide openess of the oceans or sounds increase the amount and speed of wind. In North Carolina the waters between the mainland and the outerbanks is ideal for sailing. This area is too big for the smaller boats, but the larger boats can sail up and down the inland waterway with no
