One of the science labs in the basement, which was formerly used as a classroom, has been equipped to show movies to the students during the day.

Many of the films are shown during the class periods. However, the movies in connection with the guidance programs are shown during activity period. Recently the projection room has been used several times during the lunch hour on rainy days for those students who remain at school for the entire hour.
