A number of seniors are trying out for scholarships to the various colleges for next year. More scholarships are available for high school students now than ever before.

Requirements for these scholarships are based on scholastic achievement and promise, financial need, and personal qualities such as character and leadership ability, and in most cases the applicant's successful completion of the entrance requirements.

Trying for the John Motley Morehead scholarship are Wade Smith, Franchot Palmer, Edshay Brunson, Wheaties Richardson, Bill Fisher, and Joe Kluttz.

Another scholarship is that offered by Alcoa Aluminum Company, of \$500 a year to the winner. The ones eligible must be a son or daughter of an employee. Kenneth Barbee, James Speights, Beaupine Crisco, Kay Cauthen, Vicky Culp, and Susie Culp are the students eligible from AHS.

Wake Forest is offering to any interested senior the George Foster Hawkins scholarships, forty scholarships ranging from \$300 to \$900 for each school year. Many students are showing interest in this.

Also scholarships are being offered by General Motors. These can be used in any school. This is open to students wishing to attend any accredited college of university.

Wheaties Richardson is interested in the Angier-Duke scholarships offered each year to high school seniors who want to attend Duke University.

Seven scholarships are available for the Duke School of Nursing. Three awards of \$1000 each will be given, three of \$600 and one of \$250.

The top five per cent of the senior class have taken achievement and I. Q. tests. They are Sandra Poplin, Joe Kluttz, Franchot Palmer, Wade Smith, and Bill Fisher.

These are just some of the many different scholarships that are offered. There are others such as to West Point, and Annapolis and athletic scholarships. National Honor Society gives a \$100 bond, and then too many civic clubs give money or bonds to students needing financial aid.
