The new members of the National Honor Society feted the old members at a party held May 6 at Mr. W. H. Morrow's cabin at River Haven.



This program is under the auspices of the U. S. Department of Public Health.


She was given the college en-trance test and was also inter-viewed by a panel of doctors and women of the school.
