

Track Team Has Advanced From Third To Second Place

Bulldogs Start Track Schedule

Kannapolis was the team to beat as they captured first-place honors with 47½ points in a four-school track meet on the Albemarle athletic field April 3. Mooresville proved to be the number two team in the event with 35 points, and the Bulldogs followed with 22 points. China Grove trailed the pack with only 6½ points.

Albemarle's one consolation was the fact that Roger Smith, a Bulldog tri-captain, won the broad jump event with a soaring 18 feet 9¼ inches. The summary follows:
