

Importance Of Highway Safety Stressed In Chapel Program

By comparing his experiences on the track to highway situations, Duane Carter, a 25-year auto racing veteran, stressed in a chapel program Monday morning the importance of highway safety to students.

Mr. Carter, who has participated in 10 of the noted Indianapolis "500" races, placing seventh this year, named three basic points as essential — courtesy and regard for the other driver, mental alertness, and sound mechanical condition of the automobile.

The Champion Highway Safety Program sponsors eight such racing greats, who are currently touring high schools throughout the nation. This effective approach to the highway safety problem is aimed at reducing the growing traffic death toll.

Winning the National Safety Council Public Interest Award for Exceptional Service to Safety, this program has been highly regarded by educators and civic and law enforcement officials. Since its launching in 1955 the program has been presented to

more than 2,000,000 high school students and to members of the Armed Forces both in the United States and abroad.
