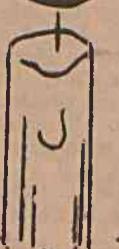

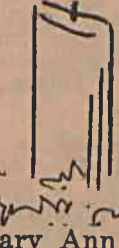

Jane Lowder and David Hall will compete on district levels for the Katherine Smith Reynolds and John Motley Morehead Scholarships, respectively.

The Katherine Smith Reynolds Scholarship for girls to the University of North Carolina at Greensboro is equivalent to the Morehead award for boys to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Both awards are based on scholarship, leadership, and achievement.

The Reynolds scholarship is worth \$1,400 per year, and covers all college expenses. A school committee selects finalists from the eleven state districts in January.

Valued at \$1750 a year, the Morehead Scholarship accepts school nominees; then the candidates enter county, district, and final competition. District competition is in January.
