CHEEONONDAH GARDEN OPENS SUNDAY FOR BENEFIT OF MUSEUM

Cheeonondah Garden, perhaps more widely known as Sloan's Garden, will be open to the public on Sunday, August 6, from 5 to 8 o'clock p.m., for the benefit of the Highlands Museum. Tickets are on sale at Highlands Drug Store and at Highlands Country Club.

Cheeonondah Garden, on the Henry W. Sloan estate on the side of Satulah Mountain, is approximately thirty years old. This garden is one of the renowned beauty spots of Western North Carolina, and contains quantities of imported plants and shrubs. Of particular interest are the two Ginkgo trees. The Ginkgo tree is the sacred tree of China, and is the oldest known tree in the world. Numbers of Scicilian and Spanish vases or jars filled with choice plants dot this garden. All of these vases are very old, some of them dating back two thousand years. A visit to this famous garden is worth many times Sunday's admission price of fifty cents.
