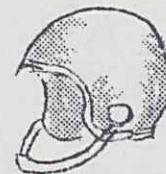


SPORTS



CHILDREN'S HOME

The Warriors came back in the second half holding Children's Home to only one touchdown (an intercepted pass) while they opened the '63 scoring column with a 55 yard scamper to pay dirt by Gene Pridgen. The game ended with the score: Children's Home 19--West 6.
