- 2nd year — White "D" with blue baseball
- 3rd year — Gold miniature baseball with white "D" and initials of performer
- 4th year — White "D" with blue baseball and four blue stripes.

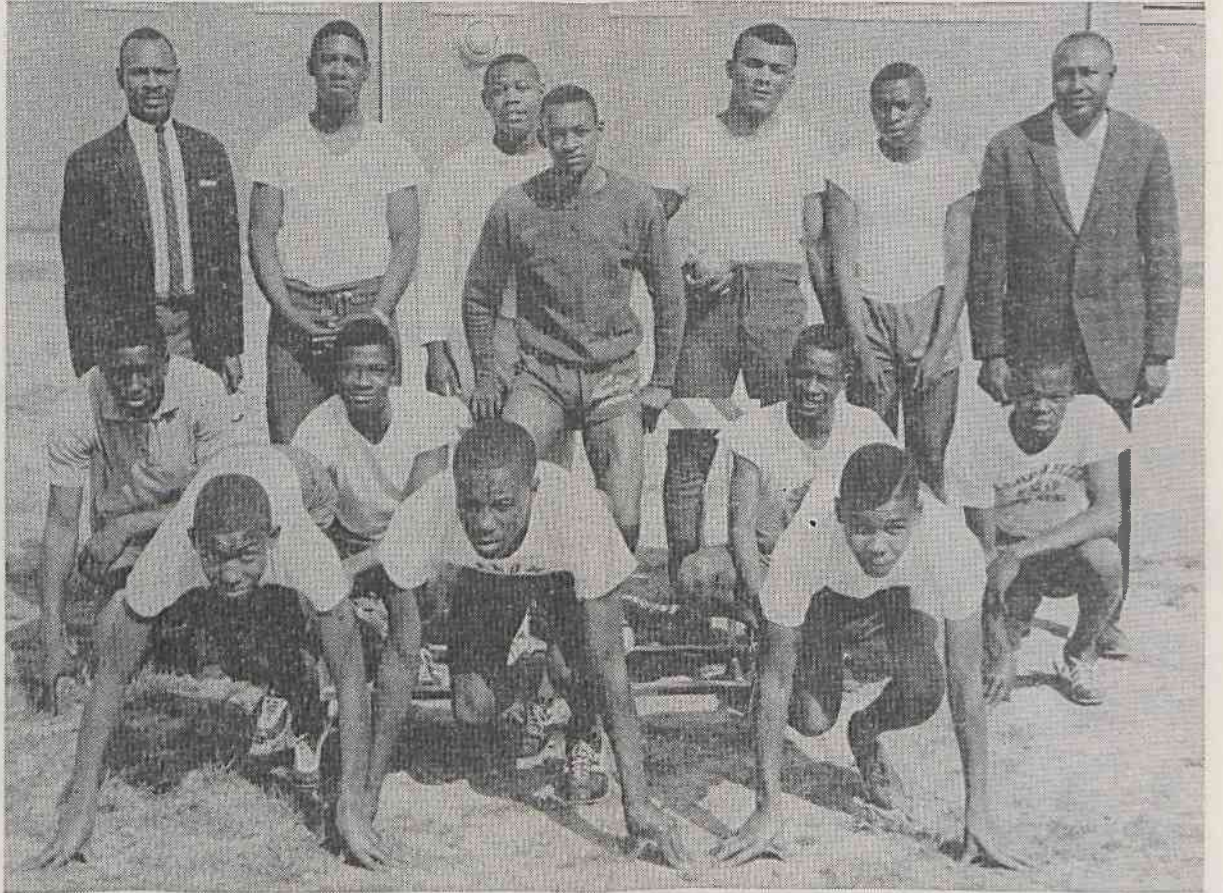

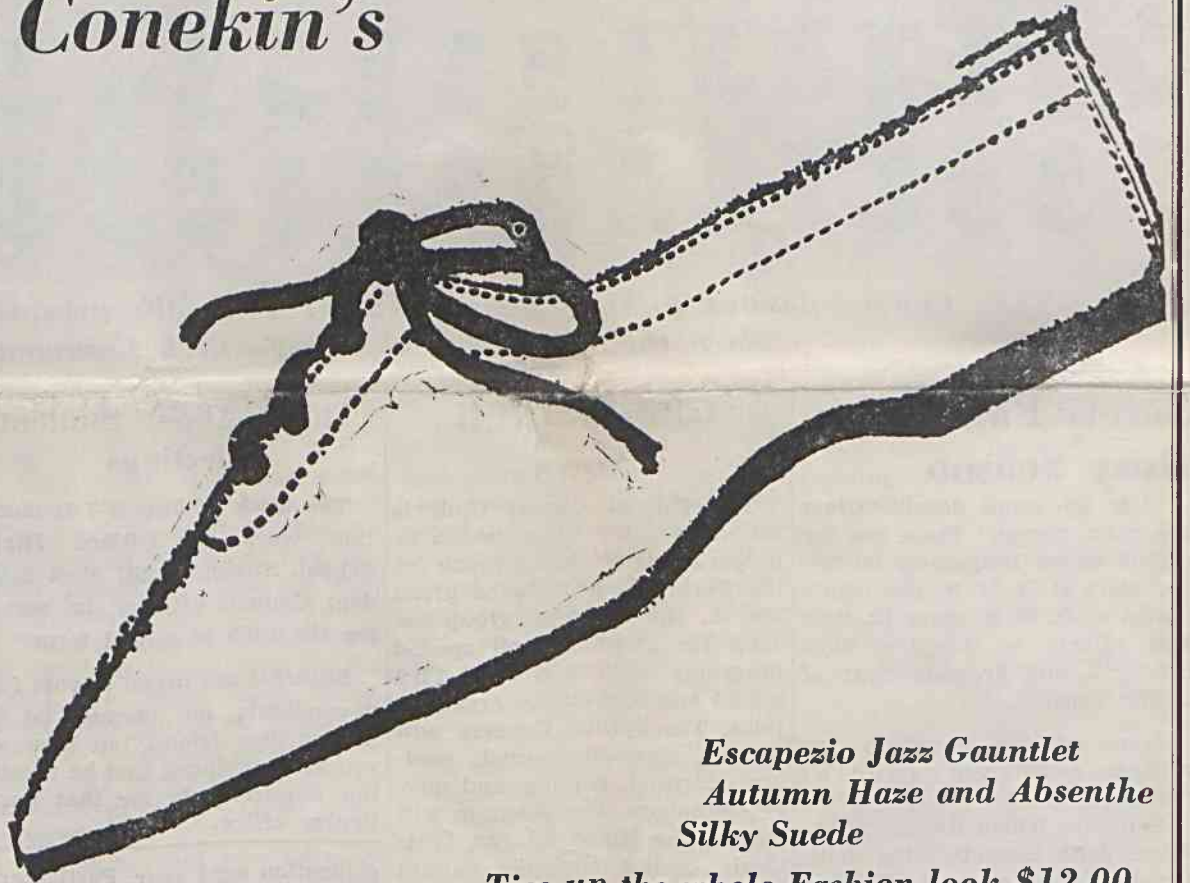
