 TALK BY' RETURNED MISSIONARYMR. POWELL PGUS BEFORE STCbents the religious conDITIONS IN APRICA

Friday morning we were fayored with a very inspiring talk by Mr Powell, one of our returned missionaries, on the trying religious conditions in Africa. Mohammedanism, he says, is sproad throughout Africa, and the number of followers of Mohammed camnot even be estimated. This widespread Mohammedan religion is not the only great source of disturbunce to the government and to the missionaries, for there is yet another, the followers of Islem. To these even the Christians are often fored to pay tribute. The most horrible factor concivable is that they ofter human sacrifice. Mr. Powell told of an instance when a Christian in the company of four other Christians watcher these followers burn a house in which were lis sister and her chith while he was powertess to rescue them or to obtain help.
His talk imprinted more deeply in our minds the profound hessing of heing ritizens of the United States. It should make everyone reatize more than ever in what a great country we live. We should realize too that of h rs deserve a peacerul country in which to live, and that it is our duty and privilege to carry them the light that provides peate.
