Mary: Dad's going to send me to a girl's finishing school.

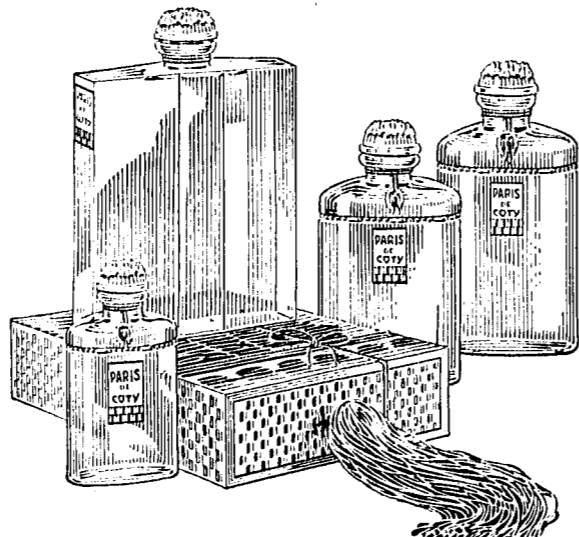

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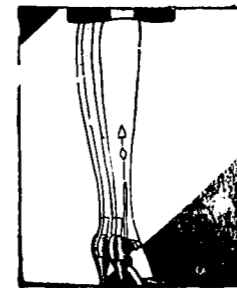
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
